

## Andheri (East) to Dahisar (East) Metro-7 corridor Metropolitan Commissioner insists on “work on schedule” from contractors

**Mumbai, May 14, 2018** – “Are you facing any financial issues? Have you procured enough machinery? Are you facing any problems completing your tasks?” The contractors constructing the Andheri (East) to Dahisar (East) Metro-7 corridor, today faced barrage of queries from Mr. R. A. Rajeev, Metropolitan Commissioner, MMRDA, who was on his first visit to the corridor. “I will not compromise on quality of work, safety of workers and delays”, said Mr. Rajeev, unequivocally.



The contractors did present a few issues such as lack of enough work-force due to non-availability of enough labour and peak-hour traffic. However, Mr. Rajeev termed these issues as ‘usual’ and insisted on meeting schedule for each and every task. “Now you also have a liberty to work during monsoon and I expect the work to go on schedule”.

During a meeting held after visiting key spots on the corridor the Commissioner also interacted and asked the General Consultants of the project to suggest ways and means to save costs and to ‘grade’ every contractor’s work on excellent, good, acceptable, not-acceptable and punishable basis every fortnight. “My task is to ensure that the projects are completed on schedule and contractors’ task is to fulfill their objective”, concluded Mr. Rajeev.



The Metropolitan Commissioner has further instructed Metro officials to "remove all debris on the corridor and complete de-silting work within a fortnight". It is pertinent to note that 50% of the nullah cleaning has been completed on the Andheri (East) to Dahisar (East) Metro-7 corridor.
