Item No.3: Revision of Development Plan of Bombay - proposals of the Bombay Port Trust.

3. The representative of the B.M.C. indicated that the Corporation is already in receipt of a letter from the Bombay Port Trust regarding their Area Development Schemes and the related issues were under examination. As part of their - Development Plan revision responsibility, the B.M.C. would attend to the B.P.T. proposals keeping the B.M.R.D.A. in the picture. But the B.P.T. representative observed that some of

the restrictions stipulated by the B.M.C. were unicceptable to the B.P.T., as, for example, those related to offices -specifically connected with the port operations or the types
of the staff quarters to be constructed for essential services

required to be performed in the Port Area. He suggested that
all these could be discussed and settled amicably in regard to
all these could be a small group comprising of the officials of the
B.M.C., B.P.T. and the B.M.R.D.A.

- 4. Reference was made in this context by the Metropolitan Commissioner to the recent demi-official letter from the Union Secretary for Transport and Shipping to the Chief Secretary to the superior jurisdiction under the Constitution of the Port the superior jurisdiction under the relevant statistics. Trust vis-a-vis the B.M.R.D.A. under the relevant statistics. The B.P.T. representative said that this could also be taken into consideration by the official group proposed above by him, but the Metropolitan Commissioner said that this letter was being examined in regard to its legal implications and it had better be dealt with independently. He added that while the operations of the Port as such should merit full consideration and coverage the B.P.T. should not allow its lands to get into private hands to be used for commercial exploitation such as warehousing, industry, etc., except to the extent and in the manner laid down in the plans for the City.
- 5. After some discussion, it was agreed that a group consisting of the Municipal Commissioner, Chairman, B.P.T., Secretary, Urban Development and Metropolitan Commissioner would meet first and see how the matters could be appropriately sorted out; since the work will have relevance most to the HURE Board, the Chairman work will have relevance most to the HURE Board, the Chairman and Member-Secretary of that Board would be with this group Action ab initio. - 6. The Chairman of the HURE Board indicated that it was proposed to put up thisitem for consideration during the next meeting of the HURE Board. It could then be taken up by the Executive Committee for deciding any points left over as may be necessary.
- 7. Arising out of this, the issue relating to the handicaps of the various agencies operating in the Metropolitan Region was considered. It was noted that many of the local bodies in the area did not have requisite staff support for preparation of projects for financing purposes. It was agreed that the --existing agencies such as the M.I.D.C., the C.I.D.C.O., etc. who have the technical competence to prepare such reports, could be utilised on agency basis for this purpose. The charges required to be paid for their services could form a part of the project cost itself. The possibility of using private consultants for this purpose should also be kept in view, especially when any special type of expertise is required. The project reports among other things should also clearly bring out the maintenance systems required for the assets created as a part of the project, the organisational structure required for -- operating the same and the related staffing patterns.
 - 8. The question of the relationship between the HURE Board of the B.M.R.D.A. and the reconstituted Housing Board was also touched upon during the discussions. The Chairman indicated that the HURE Board of the BMRDA could itself suggest how its activities could be co-ordinated with that of the proposed reconstituted State Housing and Urban Development Authority.
