Item No.1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the last (89th) Meeting of the Executive Committee.

The minutes were confirmed by the Committee.

Item No.2: Action taken on the Minutes of the last (89th) Meeting - together with progressive action on the past decisions (part 'a' only).

After discussion, the action taken report was noted by the Committee.

Item No.3: Application for permission under Section 13 of the BMRDA Act, 1974.

The application bearing registration.

No.455/1/8/84 (Executive Engineer, Survey and

Construction, Western Railway, Churchgate, Bombay-20)

was placed on the Table.

The Committee considered the application and noted that the proposal was to make addition to the existing building of the Marine Lines Station in 'C' Municipal Ward, thereby increasing the existing Floor area from 1,196.76 square metres to 3,590.28 square metres (addition of 2,393.52 sq.mtrs.) and the F.S.I. from 2 to 6. The justification given by the applicant viz. the offices of Railway Service Commission, Chief Electrical Engineer (Construction) and Additional Chief Electrical Engineer, Railway Electrification, occupying floor area of 2,100.00 square metres at their Churchgate Office were proposed to be shifted in the proposed additions, thereby vacating the area in their Churchgate Office for expansion and modernization of Computer System and sophisticated equipment was noted. The applicant had also stated that the proposal did not imply any new jobs. The Committee also found that the applicant had not given any justification as to why sizeable area of 2,000 square metres was required for Computer System at their Churchgate Office and for that matter in the Island City of Bombay. It was further noted that the land under reference fell in Residential Zone where no office area was permissible under the provisions of the Development Control Rules in force. The proposed development was within the railway premises, above the railway tracks and the same was also not permissible as per directive issued under Govt. orders, dated 18th August 1984 which required that no new construction of any building or reconstruction of an existing building should be allowed within a distance of half the height

of the said building from the railway track boundary. Even after giving an opportunity to the Railway authorities, they could not show a clear nexus of the proposed activities. The Committee agreed with the Office remarks that Railway authorities could locate the new Computer System anywhere North of Bombay Island with appropriate terminals at desired locations which would also facilitate expansion of the Computer System in future and that alternatively they could relocate dislodged offices elsewhere. As per explanation added by BMRDA Notification, No.MC/RDM-1082/ 2118(A), dated 7th October, 1980 to the Original Notification, dated 10th June, 1977, the Committee has no powers to grant any permission which may be in excess of or contrary to any provisions of the Development Control Rules. in Greater Bombay for the time being in force. The application was, therefore, rejected being ultra vires of the Committee's powers and, therefore, not maintainable.

Accordingly, the Committee passed the following Resolution:-

RESOLUTION NO. 280:

"Resolved that the application from the Executive Engineer (Survey and Construction), Western Railway, (bearing Registration No.455/1/8/84) received in terms of Section 13(2) of the BMRDA Act, 1974, being ultra-vires of the powers of the Committee, and, therefore, not maintainable, is hereby rejected."

Item No.4: Disciplinary Action against Shri Parmal Singh L., Security Supervisor in the Land Cell of the BMRDA.

The Committee considered the facts of the case contained in the Agenda Note and records of evidence accompanying it. Looking to the gravity of the proved misconduct on the part of Shri Parmal Singh L., the Committee was of the emphatic view that penalty of dismissal from service (instead of removal from service as recommended by the office) be imposed upon the said Shri Parmal Singh L. The Committee accordingly passed the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NO.281:

"Resolved that the Executive Committee having carefully considered the facts of the case contained in the Agenda Note and the records of evidence accompanying thereto, hereby decides that penalty of dismissal from

service be imposed upon Shri Parmal Singh L.; Security Supervisor, (under suspension)."

After discussion, the Committee passed the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 282:

"Resolved that the Executive Committee hereby approves the proposal to invite prequalification bids for ascertaining availability of indigenous capability of constructing quick erection flyovers, as per the Agenda Note.

"Resolved further that the Executive Committee authorises the Committee appointed by itself under the Chairmanship of Shri Shirish B. Patel (vide Item No.8 of the 89th meeting, dated 24-8-1984) to finalise the Prequalification document. It further authorises the Metropolitan Commissioner to advertise in nationally circulated newspapers inviting prequalification bids, and to take all other action including incurring the required expenditure, towards achievement of the Executive Committee's objectives in this matter."

The meeting then concluded after a vote of thanks to the Chair.
